

# Stand & Deliver Challenge Projects

The *Stand & Deliver* curriculum is revised each year to enhance the correlation between our course objectives and the educational standards and objectives of the State of New Jersey.

In the spring of 2015, Stand & Deliver groups developed and implemented community service projects under the guidelines of the Stand & Deliver Challenge Project. Each community service project meets the following criteria:

- Promotes the theme, "Be the Change" in one's school, organization, or community.
- Is developed and implemented by the students in the *Stand & Deliver* program at each site.
- Utilizes communication skills developed in the Stand & Deliver program.
- Is reflected in a student generated Project Paper detailing the service project.
- Is documented through photographs, PowerPoint presentations, and participation in the *Stand & Deliver* All-Stars Symposium, where students showcase their projects through dramatic presentations.

Project Summary: The Raptors Team tackled the complex topic of the effects of violent culture on teens.
